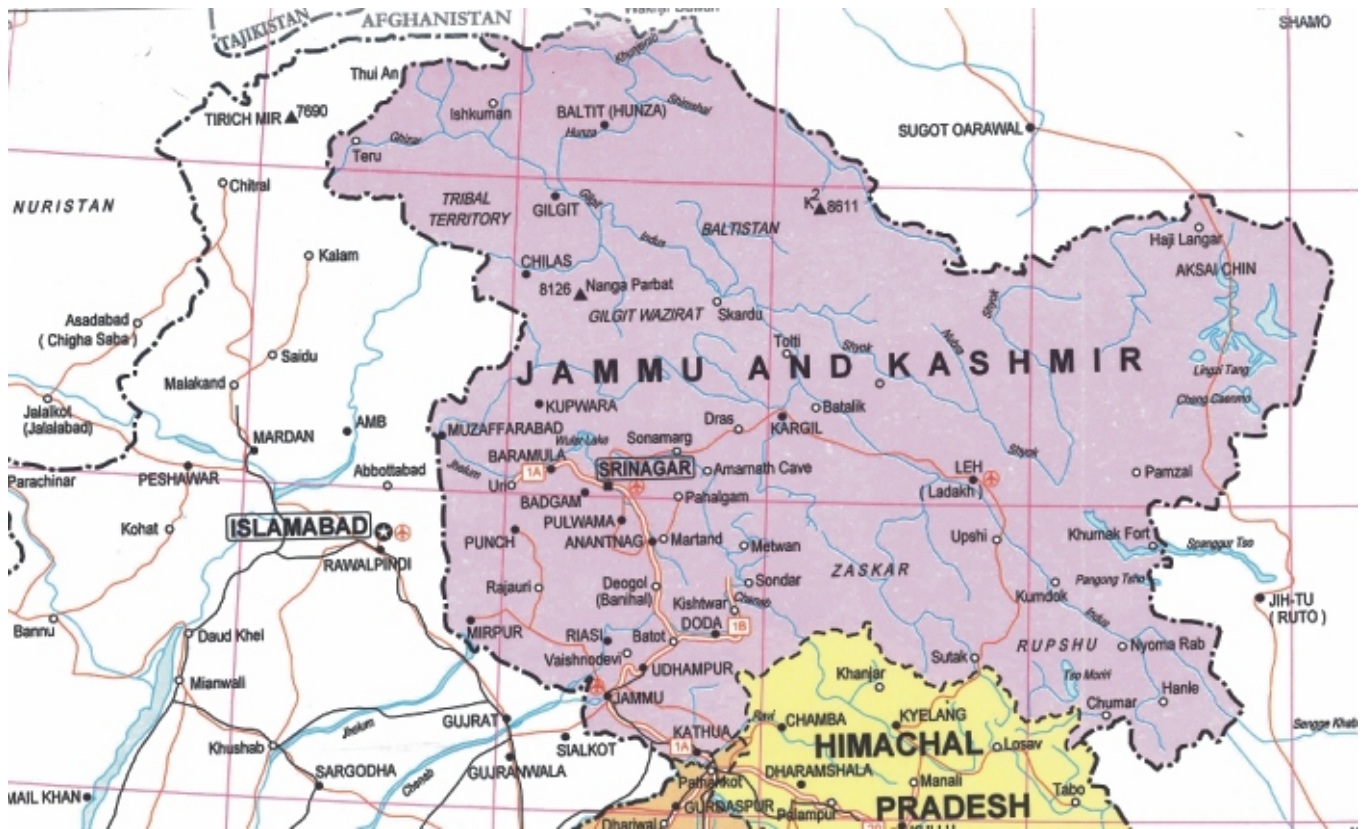

In this Edition

Taking note of the rapidly growing Chinese activities in PoK, India's Defence Minister, A K Antony recently stated that India is aware of the Chinese forays in PoK and has conveyed its concerns to China that these activities be stopped immediately. India's objections were later rejected not only by the Pakistan Foreign Office but also turned down by the AJK Prime Minister Chaudhury Abdul Majeed. Nonetheless, with Army Chief General V K Singh stating that at least 3000-4000 Chinese troops are present in PoK, the debate on Chinese involvement in PoK seems to be expounding at a fast pace.

This issue contains several reports which reveal the high rate of detentions and forced disappearances in PoK. After the leader of the Gilgit Baltistan United Movement (GBUM), Manzoor Hussain Parwana was detained and subsequently released, leader of the Labour Party of Pakistan (LPP) was arrested and put under interrogation. There were widespread protests all across including Karachi demanding the release of Babajan Hunzai. The matter was raised at the UNHCR (United Nations Human Rights Commission) Geneva in the last week September 2011. It was noted quite clearly that there is absence of freedom of expression in PoK and nationalists and media persons are shunned completely by the Pakistani authorities. These leaders have reportedly been targeted for having taken up the cause of the Ladhaki refugees in Gilgit Baltistan.

A very interesting report in the current issue captures how women residents of the Neelum Valley in the so called AJK protested against the militant activities in the region. They opposed the presence and activities of certain banned terror outfits in PoK and urged the authorities to take steps to deter infiltration across the LoC in India. This is quite significant from the point of view of India- Pakistan has all along denied India allegations the PoK is a hotbed of militancy, targeting India. The concerns of local people in PoK on militancy has authenticated and reiterated India's claim that Pakistan abets terrorism against India.

India tells China to stop development work in AJK

NEW DELHI: India has asked China to stop its infrastructure development activities in Azad Kashmir, even as it keeps a close watch on Beijing's "rapid" development of strategic roads, railway lines and airfields in Tibet as well as along the Line of Actual Control (LAC). Defence minister A K Antony, in a written reply to Lok Sabha to a question posed by 18 MPs, stated, "Government is aware that China is undertaking infrastructure projects in Azad Kashmir.

We have conveyed our concerns to China about its activities in Kashmir and asked them to cease such activities." This comes after senior Indian Army commanders recently warned that India not only faced the threat from Chinese troops along the LAC with China but it could well extend to the Line of Control (LoC) with Pakistan due to the expansive Beijing-Islamabad military nexus. Antony, stated, "China has also been carrying out rapid infrastructure development in TAR and in areas along the India-China border.

Ananth Krishnan, Xinjiang's PoK links cloud China's stance on Kashmir

At sunset, the Pakistan Café on Seman Road here bursts into life. Here, Pakistani traders from across this dusty trading town gather for tea, sharing stories of their day's work, all united by a common ambition of grabbing a slice of this region's growth. "We have great belief in what China is doing here," says one trader who has driven to Kashgar from Gilgit, in disputed Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). The ongoing transformation of this old Silk Road town has left their spirits high. China is planning to build its first Special Economic Zone (SEZ) in the west in Kashgar, hoping to boost development in southern Xinjiang which has lagged behind the rest of the region and has been the source of recent ethnic unrest.

Kashgar, a town largely inhabited by Uighurs, the ethnic Turkic group native to Xinjiang, is far removed from cities like Urumqi, the centre of Chinese development in the far west. There are no skyscrapers here - a livestock market on the city's outskirts is where most business gets done.

Intervention at UNHRC for release of Babajan Hunzai, September 28, 2011 at the Eighteenth Session of the Human Rights Council (September 12 - September 30, 2011)

I thank you Mr. President for this opportunity to speak about the state of freedom of expression, political activity and peaceful assembly in Pakistani occupied Gilgit-Baltistan, where the natives live under complete censorship as their homeland has been converted into a military garrison. The media representatives and political workers face continuous harassment and torture for exposing the inhumane treatment of the locals by their occupiers.

Recently on 25th of August, offices of Daily K-2 and Karakoram Publishing Network were vandalized by secret service agents while two journalists were arrested and tortured for exposing incidents of gang rape involving government employees as well as accounts of extra judicial murders, enforced disappearances and arbitrary detentions in the valley of Hunza. Hunza which was hit hard by the flashfloods and landslides in 2010 has this time come under heavy police and para-military attack leading to two deaths and detention and disappearance of dozens of flood victims and political workers. Prominent among them are Manzoor Parwana and Babajan Hunzai, who were punished for supporting the Ladakhi refugees living in Gilgit-Baltistan; and for opposing illegal involvement of Chinese mining companies in the region. Babajan Hunzai is currently placed in an interrogation cell and the international community is requested to pressure the fascist regime of Pakistan for his earliest release

Offbeat Justice in Gilgit-Baltistan, Arrests and Night Raids

GILGIT: Several people staged a protest rally in Gilgit against the random arrests, night raids and detentions in Hunza that the law-enforcement agencies have been carrying out in the past several weeks. After the dreadful police shooting at protesters in Aliabad in which 2 residents a retired military soldier and his young son died, a new ripple of harassment has started in the region where law-enforcement agencies arrest and detain residents under the umbrella of a flexible Anti Terrorism Act, a parallel legal invention championed by Nawaz Sharif's government in 1997. Since the clauses of the act define terror or terrorism so vague, ambiguous and limitless, any genuine, democratic or popular protest rally can fall prey to the Anti-Terrorism Courts (ATC) in Gilgit-Baltistan.

Attempt to repress protests of the despondent Attabad lake affectees has further escalated the desolation in public and the outraged youth has organized protests and awareness gatherings locally and in major cities in Pakistan a discomfort that the local administration is attempting to heal through arrests and random raids. It is alleged that protesters in Aliabad had vandalized public property, an act that falls under the purview of Anti Terrorism Act, a speedy mechanism to convict someone.

PML-N wins AJKLA Muzaffarabad seat

MIRPUR: In a keenly-contested electoral fight, PML-N nominee Barrister Iftikhar Hussain Gillani September 22 won the bye-election to LA-26 (Muzaffarabad-III) seat of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) Legislative Assembly with a thumping majority.

Barrister Iftikhar defeated his closets rival and joint candidate of Muslim Conference and PPAJK Sardar Usman Attique Khan with a huge margin of 8,848 votes. When contacted, the AJK election commission sources noted from Muzaffarabad on September 22 that according to unofficial results the number of votes landed at the AJK EC, PML-N candidate Barrister Iftikhar Hussain Gillani emerged victorious with 22,691 votes against Usman Attique, who bagged 13,843 votes. Usman is a son of outgoing AJK Prime Minister Sardar Attique Ahmed Khan.

Human rights organization Press for Peace (PFP) on urged local government of Gilgit Balistan (GB) to release political workers and lift ban on political activities. "In Pakistan controlled Gilgit Baltistan (GB) police and other law enforcement authorities are torturing political workers for voicing the rights of local people." In a press statement issued on September 22 Press for Peace (PFP) called upon local authorities to stop crackdown against people and political workers.

According to details compiled by Press for Peace (PFP), police opened fire at the people affected by Ataabad Lake when they were rallying for compensation during Chief Minister Mehdi Shah's arrival on 11 August, 2011. Last year's massive

floods created Attabad Lake, in the Hunza Valley of northern Pakistan where 242 houses, 135 shops, some schools and several hundred acres of agricultural land destroyed and damaged and victims of the lake have been protesting for compensation.

Pierre Rousset, Violent repression in the north of Pakistan

A solidarity campaign is underway in defence of Baba Jan, a leader of the LPP - the Labour Party Pakistan - and other people imprisoned in the region of Gilgit-Baltistan, in the north of Pakistan. Baba Jan, according to information from the LPP, was tortured for two days by the secret service. For more than a month, progressive activists have suffered violent repression in the region of Gilgit-Baltistan, the Himalayan “Territories of the North”. In August 2011, the police fired live bullets against people demanding payment of compensation allowances following a devastating landslide which had happened a year before in the valley of Hunza, on July 4, 2010. This landslide caused very big floods and the formation of a vast lake; this destroyed many dwellings and a transport route that is essential for local trade with China. The villagers accuse the administration of having abandoned them and of having pocketed the allowances due to 25 of the 457 affected families.

Shabbir Mir, Chinese engineers ' guards seeks pay hike

GILGIT: Hundreds of policemen, deployed for the

security of Chinese engineers on the Karakoram Highway [KKH] in Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B), staged a demonstration in front of the chief minister's office on September 17, demanding a pay increase as well as regularisation of their service. As part of upgrading KKH, the government had initiated a Karakoram Security Force (KSF) to provide security to the Chinese engineers supervising work on the highway. The KSF men were inducted on a contract basis, about three years back for a period of four years. “We are demanding a clearance of arrears, regularisation of our services and raise in our salaries,” stated one of the 100 security officials who took part in the demonstration.

Gender-based violence

Gender-Based violence is deeply rooted in regions like South Asia even today. Stereotyping women and discrimination against them get even more dangerous and terrifying in tribal or semi-tribal societies, like that of Gilgit Baltistan. Today women in Gilgit Baltistan are faced with a plethora of problems in their day-to-day life, leading to the drastic and growing trend of suicide. Gilgit Baltistan could be a paradise on earth for its pure scenic beauty, cultural diversity and natural resources. However, the region has shown a tendency of being a dangerous place for women.

A majority of women are trapped in their traditional roles, like domestic work, agricultural activities and caring for children, spouses and parents or in-laws. Their daily workload is heavier than that carried out by men.

Ghizer is one of the districts of Gilgit Baltistan where almost 369 women have committed suicide since 2005 due to family conflicts and other domestic problems. These incidents have mostly taken place among literate women in the Yasin valley, Ishkoman, Gupis and Ponial. The increasing incidents of suicide by women in Ghizer district is a big cause for concern, and all the more so when all

political, administrative and social organisations, including NGOs, remain silent spectators to the issue.

Anita Joshua, Women in Neelum Valley protest against presence of terror groups

Residents of Neelum Valley in 'Azad Jammu & Kashmir' are reportedly up in arms over renewed terrorist activity in their area which used to be the staging post for terrorists entering Jammu & Kashmir through the 1990s. A local civil society organisation 'Press for Peace' claimed that a large number of women protested last weekend against recent activities of some banned jihadi groups in the Neelum Valley. According to the PFP, the women also approached the Pakistan Army in Athmuqam the district headquarters of Neelum Valley and urged the officers to stop the "militants" from crossing into the Indian side of Kashmir. Their main fear is that terrorist activity in their area would once again adversely affect the relative peace that has held on both sides of the Line of Control since 2003 ceasefire. With memories of regular crossfire along the LoC still fresh, their fear is that the presence of jihadi organisations in the area would adversely affect their lives.

During the Eid-break last month, Pakistan stated three of its soldiers had been killed in an unprovoked firing from the Indian side while India claimed that it was foiling an infiltration bid in which one jawan lost his life.

The protestors, comprising of activists and political workers, demanded the Gilgit-Baltistan government to release Baba Jaan and other detained party workers of Labour Party Pakistan, Workers Party Pakistan, Progressive Youth Front and National Student Federation who were staging a peaceful protest against police torture and firing on the Attabad Lake affected people in Gilgit-Baltistan.

Aasim Sajjad from Workers Party Pakistan also criticised the arrests of political workers and leaders. "The government would not be able to suppress peoples' voice for their rights with torture and highhandedness," added Sajjad. The protestors warned they would stage a bigger demonstration if the leaders and workers of their parties were not released by the government before dispersing peacefully.

Shabir Choudhry, Azad Kashmir or Pakistani occupied Kashmir

The former Princely State of Jammu and Kashmir is divided between India and Pakistan; and people suffer on both sides of the divide with varying degrees. Whereas every aspect of suffering is highlighted in the Indian side of the divide, very little is stated about what goes on in the Pakistani side. This article explains some of the situation in a territory known as Azad Kashmir. Pakistan has two territories of State of Jammu and Kashmir under its control, namely Azad Kashmir and Gilgit Baltistan. Although Azad Kashmir has its own President, Prime Minister, its own flag, but the territory is not azad or independent by any stretch of imagination. Human Rights Watch (and some other international NGOs) described Azad Kashmir as anything but "Azad"; and it is because of this fact the territory is also known as Pakistani occupied Kashmir. Lal Hussain, a prominent writer and political analyst of Pakistan, in his article, 'Agony of Azad Kashmir' writes: 'So-called Azad Kashmir has a President and Prime Minister. However, the powers of these two offices are less than those of the Deputy Secretary at

the Ministry of Kashmir Affairs in Islamabad, itself one of the weakest ministries in Pakistan's federal government.' Ruling elite and other people of Azad Kashmir have been mentally enslaved through Pakistani propaganda, in name of Islam, brotherhood and through educational system prevailing in this territory for past 63 years.

Educational syllabus of so called Azad Kashmir is prepared and approved by bureaucrats of Islamabad. The prime purpose of this is not to educate people; rather it is designed to make people good and obedient slaves of Pakistan. In the past demand was that Azad Kashmiri leaders and other employees and aspirant express their allegiance to Pakistan, as prescribed by Act 74 prepared and imposed by Islamabad, which stated: "No person or political party in Azad Jammu and Kashmir shall be permitted to propagate against or take part in activities prejudicial or detrimental to the ideology of the state's accession to Pakistan". (Part 2 of section 7 of the Act 74 - Interim constitution, which remains interim after 37 years). However, demands from Azad Kashmiri leaders have changed with time, and now the rulers of Pakistan and other key players demand personal allegiance; and even allegiance to their dead ones. One can measure depth of this mental slavery by a statement of recently appointed Prime of Minister of Azad Kashmir Chaudhry Abdul Majid, who after becoming a Prime Minister went to graves of Bhutto family in Larkana, Sind, proudly stated: 'I am not a Prime Minister but Majawer of Gari Khuda Baksh'. Majawer is a man, who is a follower of a saint and like a slave or unpaid servant, looks after shrine after saint's death.

It is indeed a breeze of fresh air that the Azad Jammu and Kashmir government has reportedly chalked out a phased plan to establish a new mega industrial zone, over an area of twenty-six thousand kanals of land in Mirpur in order to give impetus to the stagnant process of industrialization in the territory. There are no job opportunities in AJK except in government departments despite huge industrial and touristic potential of the area. According to some estimates, the state is required to create about

three hundred thousand jobs for the next five to ten years but this seems to be a Herculean task because of lack of attention towards attraction of private investment or support from the Kashmiri diaspora. Nearly a million Kashmiris settled in the UK own assets worth billions of dollars and maintain bank deposits of around Rs 2,000 billion in Pakistani banks.

Shabbir Mir, Raising standards: G-B to ask UNICEF to help train teachers, management

GILGIT: Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) education department will seek help from UNICEF in training teachers and management staff, officials stated on September 18. “The outcome of this training will be made part of the G-B Education Policy,” Secretary Education Syed Hadi told members of the G-B Teachers Association. Rs800 million are being allocated for the trainings of teachers, lecturers and professors in national and foreign institutions, he noted.

The official further stated that work was in progress to constitute an independent text book board and examination board for G-B. The secretary stated that colleges in G-B are facing shortage of lecturers but noted the deficiency will be overcome in the next two years. “In this connection about 35 lecturer posts will soon be filled,” he further noted, adding that the issue of promotions for teachers and professors is being addressed on a priority basis.

Khalid Mustafa, US wants approval by Congress for Bhasha Dam funding

ISLAMABAD: The United States has linked the \$1 billion loan for Diamer-Bhasha Dam with the approval of the US Congress. The two-day Pakistan-United States Energy Dialogue held in Islamabad ended on September 15 with zero progress on funding for Bhasha Dam. Earlier, Washington had indicated that it would extend a \$1 billion loan for Pakistan's most strategic and vital project in a span of five years (\$200 million every year).

The US delegation at the energy meet was led by Special Envoy for International Energy Affairs Ambassador Carlos Pascual. The Pakistani team was led by Minister for Water and Power Naveed Qamar. “Yes, we have failed to get the formal announcement by US authorities with regards the financial facility for Bhasha dam. We had high hopes of getting some concrete announcement from US side to this effect,” a senior official who was part of the two-day Pak-US talks on energy noted.

GILGIT: An ongoing two-week long survey in

Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) aims to document key characteristics of the flora and fauna in the region's wetlands. The survey was started by the World Wide Fund (WWF) under the Saving Wetlands Sky High Programme (SWSH) on September 9 and will continue till September 22. Six wetlands will be covered in the survey.

The survey will cover mammals, birds, reptiles and terrestrial vegetation found on and around the lakes, officials noted on September 17. According to High altitude Wetlands Conservation Officer Farasat Ali, the survey team comprises a dozen experts, who will collect primary data on wetland biodiversity to explore their status, distribution, population, threats and alliance of the selected high altitude wetlands.
