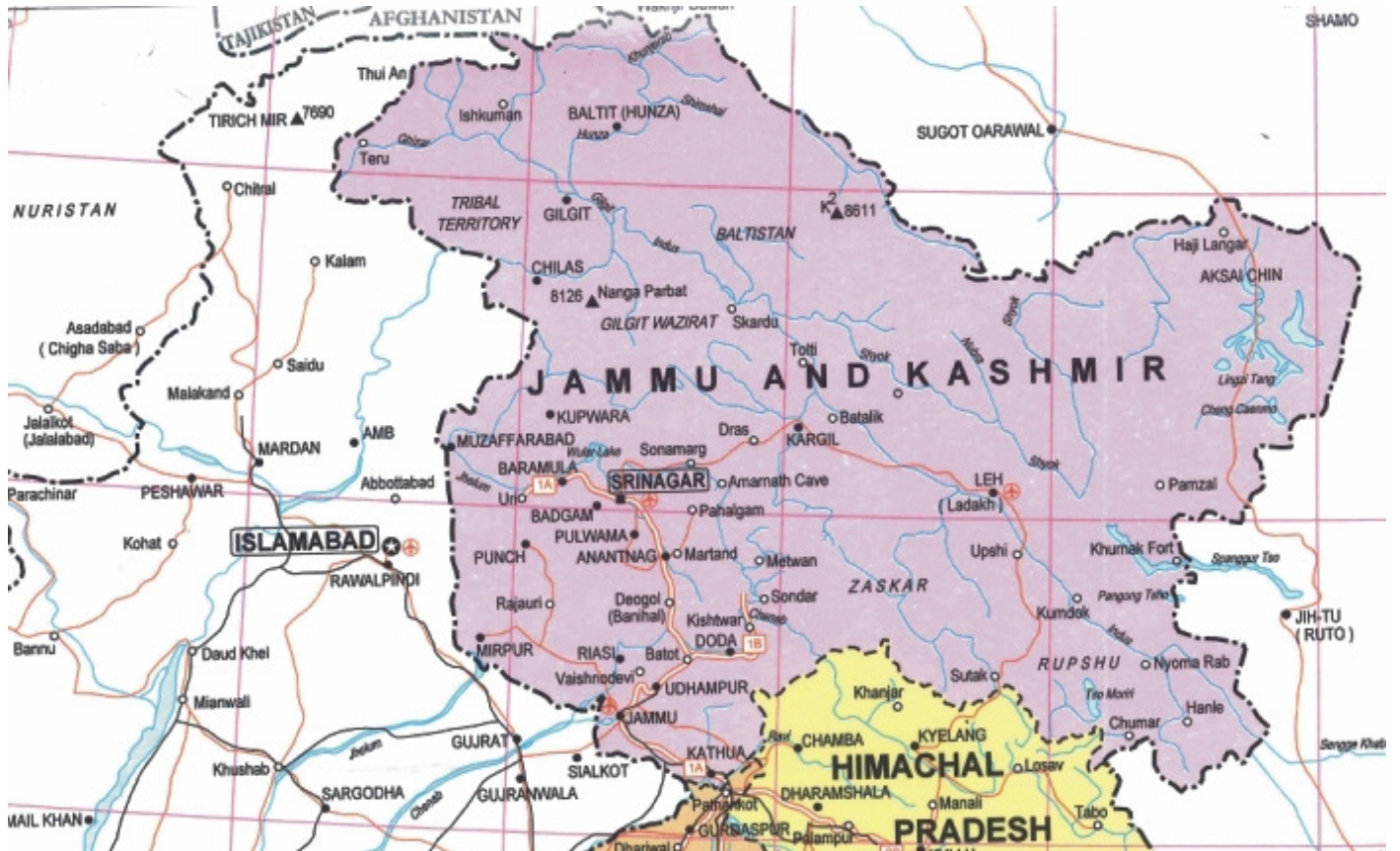

Since June 2013 when members of the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) killed nine foreign tourists at the base camp of Nanga Parbat, Gilgit-Baltistan was relatively safer than the other parts of Pakistan. But the recent incidents, in which many girl schools were burnt, indicated the re-emergence of the terrorist threat in the region. The other part of the region, so-called “Azad Kashmir” also saw the anti-Ahmadi protests, after the Pakistan Supreme Court acquitted Asia Bibi in the long-pending blasphemy case. If extremism and terrorism return back to the region, not only will it affect the social fabric of the society but the highly hyped CPEC project will come under the lens of terrorists.

Zeeshan Aziz, “Gilgit-Baltistan (GB) Govt Clarifies CS’s Visit to China”

Gilgit-Baltistan (GB) government on November 1 contradicted a news item published in local newspaper regarding the visit of Chief Secretary (CS) GB, Babar Hayat Tarar to China, has clarified that the CS’s visit to China was a routine official visit that was organised by the Federal and Chinese governments. During the visit, the CS was accompanied by GB cabinet ministers, MLAs and representatives from Pakistan Army. The delegation during visit to Changyang signed further expansion of MOUs of cooperation in different sectors.

During the visit, matters relating to border security and further enhancing cooperation in health, education, trade and agriculture sectors were also discussed.

“President AJK lauds independent report by British All-Party Parliamentary Kashmir Group”

The Group recommends repeal of the black laws in ‘IOK’, calls for investigations into the unmarked mass graves discovered in ‘IOK’ in order to establish the identity of the victims, asks the Government of India to immediately ban the use of the pellet shotguns, asks that India must open its prisons to international inspection, and urges India and Pakistan to work to resume regularized visa-regulated civilian travel

across the Line of Control and reunite separated families.

“India objects Pak-China Bus Service via PoK”

India has raised strong objections over Pakistan-China proposed bus services which will run through Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). The External Affairs Ministry has criticized the move, terming it as a “violation of India’s sovereignty and territorial integrity”. India maintains that PoK is Indian Territory.

Responding to media queries, MEA spokesman Raveesh Kumar said: “we have lodged strong protests with China and Pakistan on the proposed bus service”. Mr. Kumar said It has been India’s consistent and well-known position that the “so-called China-Pakistan ‘Boundary Agreement’ of 1963 is illegal and invalid, and has never been recognized by the Government of India”.

The China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) service will be launched on November 3. According to Radio Pakistan, the bus route will be from Lahore to Kashgar in China. The service will run four days a week from Lahore to Tashkurgan.

“APPGK report reflects human rights violations in held valley: Masood”

AJK President Sardar Masood Khan has lauded an independent report on “Human Rights in Jammu and Kashmir” launched at the House of Commons by the

All Parties Parliamentary Group on Kashmir (APPKG). Speaking at the ceremony, attended by more than 30 Members of Parliament and Lords representing all major political parties, the AJK president said, “This is a potent moment. The British Parliament has broken its silence over an issue that concerns the fate and political future of 20 million Kashmiris who have been striving for the attainment of their right to self-determination for the past 71 years”.

The President informed the lords and MPs, who attended the ceremony, that Azad Kashmir with the help of the armed forces of Pakistan was bearing the burden of 40,000 refugees without the assistance of an international agency like the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).

“China, Pak justify bus service via PoK after red-flagging by India”

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Lu Kang on November 1 defended the bus service and said it has nothing to do with the territorial dispute and will not change its “principled stance” on the Kashmir issue, India’s Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) lodged strong protests with both China and Pakistan. The bus service is being launched on November 3. Pakistan rejected the protest, citing the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) resolutions. A statement issued by Pakistan Foreign Office accused India of raising frivolous issues.

The bus will travel through PoK’s Gilgit-Baltistan region, which is part of Jammu and Kashmir. Pakistan and China don’t share a border and its only link to China is through PoK, which shares border with China as well as with Afghanistan. The 30-hour trip will take passengers Chilas, Gilgit, Sost, Khunjerab Pass. The passengers have been asked to book their seats at least a week before travel while the one-way ticket from Lahore to Kaghar have been priced at Pakistani Rs 13,000 per seat.

“AJK announces holiday at edu institutes”

All the private and public sector educational institutions will remain closed for next two days in Mirpur and other parts of the AJK due to continued suspension of the routes leading to the major cities of AJK. The routes’ blockage has hit the business activity in the state. National newspapers appearing from Lahore and Islamabad could not reach AJK on November 1 due to suspension of the transport since October 31 morning.

The protestors, belonging to various sects of the Muslims, raised slogans against the decision besides delivering speeches demanding immediate withdrawal of the verdict by the Supreme Court of Pakistan. They vowed to continue the protest demonstrations across the AJK till the acceptance of their demand. They expressed complete solidarity with the country-wide protests against the SC verdict across Pakistan. Addressing a protest rally at central Shaheed Chowk in Mirpur on November 1, speakers including leading Ulema and Muslim religious scholars announced to observe black day on November 2 in Mirpur district and other parts of the AJK against the acquittal of blasphemy accused Aasia Bibi by the apex court of the country.

Farhan Zahid, “Recent Wave of Terrorism in Pakistan’s Gilgit-Baltistan Region”

The most significant terrorist incident in the region took place in June 2013, when members of the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) killed nine foreign tourists (hikers from the United States, China, Slovakia, Lithuania, Ukraine and Nepal), their guide and chef (Express Tribune, June 23, 2013). The hikers

were at the base camp of Nanga Parbat Mountain when the terrorists attacked. The incident was disastrous for Pakistan's tourism industry, which suffered significantly after the incident. Just two months after the attack, the team investigating the case was ambushed in Chilas town. The district superintendent of police and two military officers were killed.

The re-surfacing of Islamist terrorism in the northern Gilgit-Baltistan region of Pakistan is a matter of grave concern for Pakistan, which benefits from tourism in the region. The region is in close proximity to the restive Chinese Xinjiang Autonomous Region and also borders the Indian State of Jammu and Kashmir. The region is overwhelmingly Shia and has experienced sectarian strife in the past that militants might attempt to exploit. The recent growth of Islamist militancy in the region is a cautionary sign. According to one estimate, a total of 1,500 girls' schools have been burned down or blown up by Islamist terrorists during the last 10 years (Nation, August 4). Tribal areas of Pakistan—including in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa province and Gilgit-Baltistan—have experienced burnings of girls' schools in the past, and often times such incidents have preceded a broader, full-fledged Islamist insurgency.

“AJK bigwigs review 1st fiscal quarter's performance”

Expressing dismay over the prolong inordinate delay in payment of official advertisements published in the national and state print media, pending against various departments of AJK government, AJK Prime Minister Raja Farooq Haider Khan on November 2 directed all the Secretaries to ensure payment of departmental advertisements within next 15 days to all concerned newspapers, pending against the government functionaries. The AJK PM also directed removal of the obstacles as soon as possible for supply of potable water to the residents of Mirpur. He said that AJK government achieved its developmental targets better than the four provinces of the country. However, he said the departments need to pay more heed to the quality. Shah said that funds amounting to Rs4 billion and Rs400 million were released in the first quarter out of which 78 percent have been incurred. Same amount was issued for the second quarter. He said funds amounting to Rs5 billion in development mode are still available in the accounts. Farooq Haider asked the ministers and secretaries to compile a report after reviewing pace of development and monitoring of development projects which should also be forwarded to Prime Minister Secretariat. He said Fruit Development Programme was being re-launched in AJK while special attention was being paid to social and productive sector in Annual Development Programme..

“CPEC-BRI to foster collaboration, bring nations closer: AJK president”

Azad Jammu and Kashmir President Sardar Masood Khan while speaking at the Royal United Services Institute (RUSI), London, has said that the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), a hugely beneficial project for Pakistan, China and potentially other countries of the region, was on track and would be completed with success.

To start with, the volume of Chinese debt (\$ 6 billion) is relatively small in the overall volume of Pakistani debt. The interest rates, he said, included the range of zero percent, concessional loans, preferential buyer’s loans and commercial credit lines, with a long repayment period. Pakistan as a solvent country would repay its debts, he said. Pakistan or other countries participating in the BRI do not fear that Chinese heavy investments would lead to the export of Chinese political model. China has demonstrated over the years that it abides by the principles of respect for the sovereignty and political independence of other nations, as well as non-interference in their internal affair.

Ghulam Abbas, “Thor tribe requests SC to give prescription rights in boundary case”

As the Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan is hearing the case related to the boundary dispute between Gilgit Baltistan (GB) and Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, the residents of GB's area, Thor, have requested the superior court to consider their rights and claim over the disputed land. The disputed territory measuring almost six kilometres and located alongside the Karakoram Highway on the KP-GB border was previously controlled by the federal government through the Frontier Constabulary (FC). The FC soldiers were deployed there after four tribesmen, three from Harban tribe and one from Thor were killed in an exchange of fire in 2014. The territorial dispute has become a major hurdle to the execution of the 4500MW Diamer-Basha hydropower power project.

“Pakistani courts cannot take up Azad Kashmir cases: IHC”

A division bench of the Islamabad High Court (IHC) has annulled an over two-year old decision of a single bench regarding the appointment of a Grade-20 officer as member Inland Revenue Department of Azad Jammu and Kashmir Council. As per the verdict, according to Azad Kashmir Interim Act 1974, IHC or any other court of the country (Pakistan) does not have the authority to listen to any appeal against the decision of the Kashmir Council chairman, and only the Azad Kashmir High Court is the concerned institution for the plaintiff.

In the decision, the judge directed the Kashmir Council chairman, who is the Prime Minister of Pakistan, to issue appointment letters and termed the IHC as a suitable forum for hearing the plea.

“GB governor asks Centre to replace CS”

The federal government had appointed Tarar as chief secretary GB few days before general elections 2018. Tarar is a grade-21 officer of Pakistan Administrative Service (PAS) group.

“LoC traders from PaK urge Pakistan president, PM to save barter trade”

According to them, despite their meetings with several government functionaries, including Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) chairman Muhammad Jahanzeb Khan and Federal Kashmir affairs minister Ali Amin Gandapur, on the issue, there had not been

any change in the “belligerent attitude” of the customs department.

A group of intra-Kashmir traders has called upon President Arif Alvi and Prime Minister Imran Khan of Pakistan to direct the authorities concerned to work out a permanent solution to their longstanding problem in the face of confiscation of their goods they bring to the Pakistani markets under barter system.

The traders said, “One of the popular slogans across the LoC was Kashmir ki mandi, Rawalpindi (Rawalpindi is the market of Kashmir), but the treatment being meted out to their goods in Pakistan is disheartening them as they have pooled their lifelong savings in this activity.” The traders called upon the president and premier to direct the authorities concerned to officially notify specific point(s) for collection of custom duty on the merchandise arriving from across the LoC, “if at all it was unavoidable.”

Sarah Iftikhar / Haneeah Jawed, “Sukuk can be floated for funding Diamer-Bhasha dam”

Over the previous more than a decade, more than 100 Sukuk (Islamic bonds) have been issued in Pakistan with the first in 2006. These add up to around Rs1.16 trillion worth of Sukuk issued over these years. Government issuances have overwhelmed the Sukuk showcase, with Rs865 billion worth of bonds being issued by the government of Pakistan and around Rs150 billion by open area substances. Over the similar period, corporate Sukuk issues were at around Rs170 billion.

In 2012, Sukuk issuances for infrastructure projects rose 140.2% year-on-year (YoY) to \$27.81 billion. In the year, 21.2% of global Sukuk were related to infrastructure. Malaysia had the highest number of such issuances followed by Saudi Arabia. Pakistan, Indonesia, Kuwait and Brunei are some other notable countries that have floated infrastructure Sukuk.

Keeping in view the current water crisis that Pakistan faces, one of the critical challenges that needs to be addressed is the financing of Diamer-Bhasha dam. Until now, Rs4.693 billion has been collected in the Supreme Court’s dam fund but this constitutes a very small portion of the Rs1,900 billion required to complete the project.

“Pakistan govt constitutes panel to review legal status of disputed Gilgit-Baltistan region”

The apex court had given the instructions while hearing 32 identical petitions concerning the constitutional status of the disputed territory. The main constitutional petition was filed by the Gilgit-Baltistan Bar Council through its vice-chairman Javed Ahmed.

“JUI-F chief decides to reorganise JTI”

The central committee of Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) in its meeting held under the chairmanship of Maulana Fazalur Rehman has dissolved the bodies of Jamiat Tulaba-e-Islam (JTI) and decided to commence new membership campaign of Jamiat Tulaba-e-Islam. JUI-F Central Executive Committee tasked Hidayatullah Pirzada to nominate organizers of Jamiat Ulama-e-Islam from all the four provinces, Azad Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, FATA, and Islamabad.

All the conveners have been asked to nominate conveners for districts in their respective provinces and a report thereof may be forwarded to the center.

They (Government) are pushing us to outskirts. They say they will provide us plots. We cumulatively rejected their proposal. More than 30 representatives from affected villages are present here. We do not want to go from here. We do not want to go out of Diامر. We want to live in Gilgit-Baltistan. The agreement that was done should be followed.” Uncertainty and apprehensions are looming large among the public in Gilgit-Baltistan. Pakistan’s Diامر Basha Dam project has not only ravaged the natural resources of the illegally occupied territory but also left a large number of homeless and poverty-stricken.

The new plant, which would cost Rs5 billion, would be installed in Diamer area to provide electricity to machines, offices and other installations of the dam project, sources said. The proposal for constructing a power plant was earlier given by the Ministry of Water Resources. Subsequently, ECNEC approved to include Tangir Hydropower (15MW) in the Diamer-Basha Dam project. The committee has

approved the revised cost of the entire project of Diamer-Bhasha Dam at Rs479.686 billion. The main objective of the project is to construct a 500kV transmission network to provide interconnection facilities for evacuation of electricity from the abovementioned projects being constructed under CPEC. The meeting also discussed and approved the Balochistan Water Resource Development Project (Zhob and Mula river basins) at a cost of Rs16,453.40 million. The project will provide sufficient relief to the districts of Muslim Bagh, Qila Saifullah, Zhob, Khuzdar, Jhal Magsi and part of Kalat.
